Brussels, 26 September 2022 -Today starts the European Biotech Week 2022 (hereafter – EBW) which gathers the science community to celebrate the benefits and value that biotechnology brings to people and the planet. EuropaBio’s flagship campaign this year will take place for the 10th time inviting experts, policymakers and citizens to almost 100 events taking place across Europe.

Biotechnology and Life Sciences Associations (at national and local level), schools, universities, research centres, government institutions, companies, science museums and the media have partnered to discuss the recent developments in the field and showcase the best practices.
